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INTRODUCTION

FEASIBILITY STUDY

A Feasibility study should explore how the proposed project will support the campus academic master plan and impact the current instructional capacity. A feasibility study is an assessment of the practicality of a proposed plan or project. A feasibility study analyses the viability of a project to determine whether the project or venture is likely to succeed.

FIVE TYPES OF FEASIBILITY STUDY

The Five types of Feasibility study are

- 1. Scheduling Feasibility- Timeline estimations & optimizing resources.**
- 2. Operational Feasibility- Control, Efficiency & Services.**
- 3. Economic Feasibility- Cost-Benefit analysis.**
- 4. Technical Feasibility- Risk assessment & solutions.**

This types can help and identify the financial, legal and all challenges of a proposed project by evaluating: What exposures the students are acquiring from the campus, What the estimate would be to fund new projects etc.

OBJECTIVES

This study is designed to help decision-makers determine whether or not a proposed project or investment is likely to be successful. It identifies both the known costs and the expected benefits. A Feasibility study starts with a preliminary analysis. Stakeholders are interviewed, students opinions are conducted, and a strategic plan is prepared. All of this information is analysed to make an initial "go" or "no-go" decision.

If it's a go, the real study can begin. This includes listing the technological considerations, studying the student's behaviors, describing the academic strategy and outlining the necessary human capital, project schedule and financing requirements.

FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL OUTLAY PLAN(ACTION YEAR)

2. INFRASTRUCTURE

2.1 COLLEGE LIBRARY

INTRODUCTION

Library is always considered as the real ‘Powerhouse’ / ‘knowledge hub’ of any educational institution. Yuvakshetra Institute of Management studies, aims to open a full fledged new library [library block] with computerised facilities in an area of **26000 Sq. Ft** with proper lighting and ventilation. This outline is intended to initiate a larger facility planning process. It includes: General Reading corner, Reference section, Research Cubicles, Periodical corner, Language Lab/ Speech Lab, an IT Hub for conducting online exams and references, General Computer Lab, Bookstall, Reprographic facilities, Content creation studio, Digital library, Audio Video library, studio for physically challenged, Tutor’s Room, Library Training area, space for accountant, Librarian, Reception, Bamboo Courtyard for open reading and separate toilet facilities for girls and boys. The seating capacity of the library reading room is 200. The College Library works with the vision of its college to create an integral system that meets the educational needs of the students, faculties and community at large.

- give students a wider and deeper understanding of the universe of knowledge with the improved facilities

- Work as an independent agency and encourage life-long learning beyond the prescribed syllabi so that the students can be more enlightened and knowledgeable.
- To open the door to the worldwide of books that lie beyond the borders of one's own field of specialization; and
- To help the teacher in keeping abreast of developments in his field;
- To provide resources necessary for research in the field of interest to the college;
- To bring books, students and scholars together under conditions, which encourage reading for pleasure, self-discovery, personal growth and sharpening of intellectual curiosity

The College Management targets to set up a full fletched modern library. The estimated amount for building the new library is Rs. 4 Crore.

TIME BOUND

The estimated time to complete the construction work of the fully furnished library is 2 years [2024]

Library is a growing organism. The space requirement is a primary need and it is determined by its purpose. The place for the library is adjacent to Jubilee Block. The plan of execution is as follows,

- Planning a Library Building Design
- Preparation of a library proposal
- Getting approval from the government



- Starting the construction work soon after the approval
- Forming a committee comprising members from Management, faculties, accounts department for the completion of construction work within the estimated time, ie by 2024.

2.2 COLLEGE CANTEEN

INTRODUCTION

The college is providing canteen facility to the students as well as teaching and non-teaching staff of the college. Due to the increase in intake of students in the past few years the college Management intends to flourish the canteen facilities. The Institution aims to cater the demands of the students and plan to accommodate **200** persons at a time. It has planned a spacious canteen set up in an area around **12300 Sq. ft.** Kitchen staff takes care to provide the students and staff a nutritious and hygienic food at our campus canteens. A variety of hygienic food and snack items includes South and North Indian Meals, Variety Rice's, Fresh Juices, etc.

OBJECTIVE

As many students come from distant places, it is essential for the students to have nutritious food and refreshments at affordable prices so as to participate in the daily academic activities actively. The college canteen plays an important role in this regard by catering the daily nutritional requirements of students and staff members.

- Accommodating more number of students in a spacious background
- Providing wholesome and quality food at reasonable price for more number of students
- Creating an attractive and different menu to cater the nutritional needs of the students
- Developing good and healthy food habits among students
- Maintaining a good ambience and good aesthetics of the canteen

The students, teacher's staff and outsiders would have pleasure of enjoying healthy food in pleasant and soothing environment. Time would be consumed for finding food in a single place, variety of selective food in low price. The canteen would attract more and more number of students which would enhance in economy. The canteen would match the standard of college. Increase in economy would foster maintenance, addition of infrastructure property. Students would remain healthy free from confusion of food related diseases.

2.3 ICT ENABLED CLASSROOMS

INTRODUCTION

Information and Communication Technology (ICT) in education is the mode of education that use information and communications technology to support, enhance, and optimise the delivery of information. ICT enabled classroom includes computers, projectors, speakers, touch pad-pen, learning software and mobile applications. ICT used in the classroom is important for giving students opportunities for effective learning. Currently the institution has 29 ICT enabled classrooms. The institution is in a pace to convert all the classrooms to ICT enabled ones by 2027 with the support of PTA fund.



OBJECTIVE

One way to improve the quality of education is to make use of efficient technology in an institution. This will open up more opportunities for the teachers and students as well.

- Turning all the classrooms into ICT enabled ones will help students to become competent and confident users.
- It aims to equip learners with the appropriate social skills required to cooperate with fellow ICT learners for a more productive learning experience.
- To empower students who are unable to use this technology outside the institution by ensuring sufficient access to those students.
- To facilitate better involvement of the students in learning activities as the number of smart classes would increase, thus promoting better social understanding.
- ICT aims to assist students to grow personally by facilitating different methods of learning.

OUTCOME

ICT in education improves engagement and knowledge retention: When ICT is integrated into curriculum; students become more engaged in their work. This is because technology provides different opportunities to make it more fun and enjoyable in terms of teaching the same things in different ways. It improves the effectiveness of education. It enhances scope of education by facilitating mobile learning and inclusive education. It facilitates research and scholarly communication.

Hence both students and faculties would be enriched.

BUDGET

The College Management targets to transform all the classrooms to ICT enabled ones. The estimated amount for a classroom is Rs. 75000. The number of classes may vary if new courses sanctioned.

TIME BOUND

The estimated time to complete the plan of converting all the classrooms to ICT enabled ones is 2027.

PLAN OF EXECUTION

- Forming a committee comprising members from Management, faculties, accounts department for the completion of the work within the estimated time, i.e. by 2027.
- Need to organize and coordinate the requirement of each class; allocate the budget



- It is through partnership and collaboration between educators, parents, employers, students (PTA) and other stakeholders that the vision of the strategic plan can become a reality.
- There is a need for the adoption of standards for the acquisition, implementation and use of ICT

Management, faculties, parents and students must assume ownership of institution level ICT project.

3.1 Incubation center

Yuvakshetra Institute of Management studies is proud to initiate an incubation centre to support the students and community to obtain first-hand experience to promote innovation driven activities at the college and to provide a wholesome range of support like space, mentoring, training programs etc. Through the incubation centre, students gain hands-on experience in innovation while being nurtured and encouraged by faculty, management and industry experts. The centre also aims to collaborate with high impact ventures in various social, educational, commercial and other sectors of the society. Business incubation centres in collaboration with Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development Centres (IEDC) will be planned. Production and selling of namely LED bulbs, beauty soaps, pain balms and other valued added products will be mentored and supported under this centre

Objective

- To offers working spaces, expert's opinions and also guidance from the industry
- To provide an opportunity to introduce to the new technological demands
- To organize practical activities and hand on training

Plan of execution

The institute aims to organize various training and mentoring activities by promoting multidisciplinary approaches to promote the development of new entrepreneurs and start up initiatives. The institute will provide all the basic infrastructural support, i.e. Computer, physics and chemistry laboratories, mentoring, technical support, networking with professional experts, consultants and advisor of incubator companies. The centre will be keen to host various workshops, training session, and competitions for aspiring entrepreneurs and support them by providing necessary resources such as mentoring, consultancy and networking.

3.2 Community colleges

Education aims the overall and wholesome development of an individual. It has been noticed in the recent years that there is a shift from the conventional education system. One need to be equipped with various skills to meet the various demands and opportunities in the current competing world. Community College provides an alternative education and training system for skill based career oriented vocational degree, certificate & diploma courses. The Concept of 'Community College' is to provide access for suitable employment to the economically challenged youth of the nearby villages (Adopted) through a broad spectrum of Job oriented and skill based / Credit charged Diploma / Certificate courses they could choose from, on the basis of need demand and viability. YIMS is currently equipped with good computer and language labs and resourceful teachers which can be used for the conduct of the various courses.

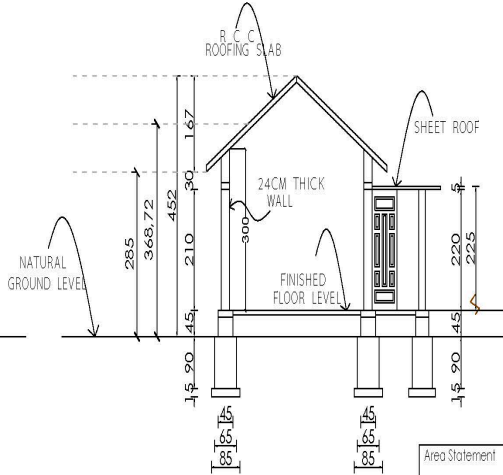


Construction Plan of the Library

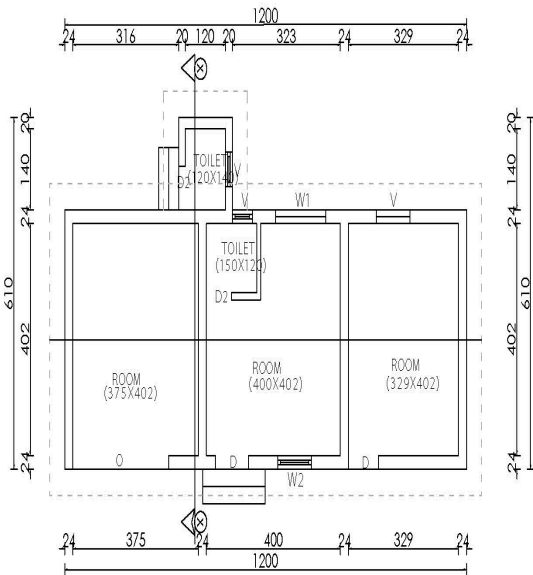

Simulation of proposed Library




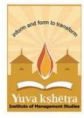

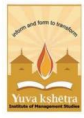

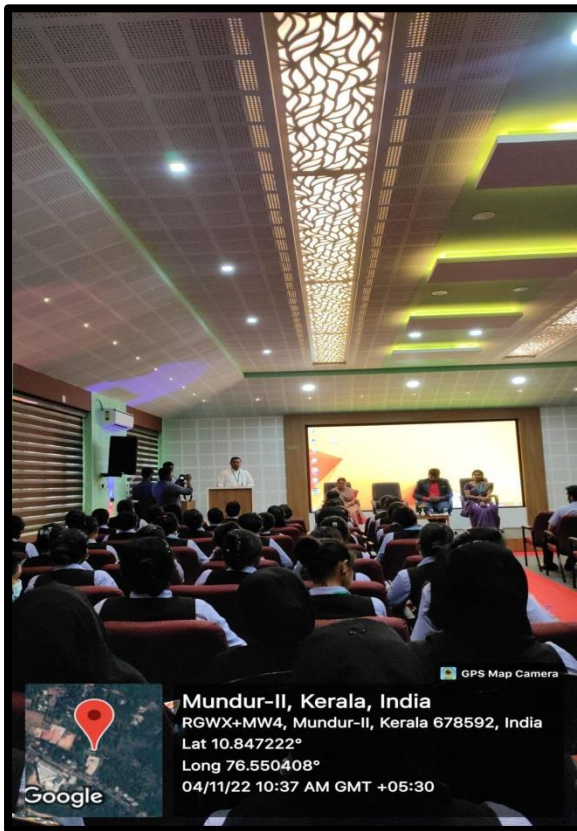

OBJECTIVE: To provide hand on training students to assemble LED bulbs and tube lights as a part of skill development.

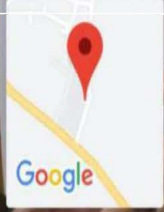

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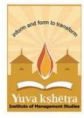
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FREESHIPS





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YIMS FREESHIP POLICY

The aspirants who wish to pursue their academic journey in Yuvakshetra Institute of Management Studies most often face the herculean task of arranging funds. To overcome this, the institution has made provisions to aid them. Freeship is basically a financial aid offered to students for pursuing their studies by providing a concession in their fee amount. The amount of concession will be fixed by the management depending upon the financial background of meritorious students.

SCHEME

- 1. Palakkad Diocese Students Scholarship (PDSS):** The scholarship is awarded to those students who have scored more than ninety percentage of marks in the Higher Secondary Examination and should be under the Diocese of Palakkad.
- 2. Yuvakshetra Educational Scholarship Project (YESP):** The YESP scheme provides freeship to a fixed percentage of students from both UG and PG every year. This is highly beneficial for students and ensures that a maximum number of deserving students benefit from it each year. In addition, as an initiative of IQAC, PG students are provided with benefits for SWAYAM/Project/Internship/Add-On/Others. These additional provisions significantly contribute to digital empowerment by fostering the development of critical digital skills and enhancing technological literacy among students.
- 3. Employees' Children Freeship:** Freeships will be provided for employees' children studying in the college.
- 4. Installment Facility:** Students who cannot pay their fee completely are given the opportunity to pay their fees in installments. The applications to avail this facility will only be approved by the Director.

Guidelines

Students availing any of the above Freeships must apply for it through an application letter along with all the necessary supporting documents. A student enrolled in the First Year of Degree or PG Courses, who is economically weak but diligent is eligible to apply. A Student Counsellor is appointed to have a complete review of the aspirants as inculcating evidence for the institution. Based on the report, the Institute will decide the concession for the Freeships.




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
