The National 5-Day Faculty Development Program (FDP) titled "Empowering the Millennial Mentors" was organized by the Department of Management, YIMS, from June 1 to June 5, 2020. This event aimed to enhance the mentoring and teaching skills of educators while fostering a culture of motivation and value inculcation in students. Over 120 participants, including educators from diverse parts of the country, took part in this program.

The sessions focused on equipping educators with strategies to guide students better and align educational practices with industry standards. Key Insights and Highlights

Feedback Metrics

- 3. Usefulness of Content in Practical Application
- 4. Interaction and Question-and-Answer Sessions
- 5. Technical Aspects and Coordination
- 6. Overall Satisfaction with the Program

Participants rated these aspects on a scale of 1 to 5, with 1 being "Poor" and 5 being "Excellent."

Key Findings

1. Relevance of the Topics:

- \circ 85% of participants rated the topics as highly relevant (5/5).
- o The selected themes addressed contemporary issues in education and mentorship effectively.

2. Clarity and Engagement of Resource Persons:

o 88% of participants appreciated the clarity of presentations and the engaging delivery of sessions.

3. Usefulness of Content in Practical Application:

o 90% of participants found the knowledge imparted directly applicable to their professional roles.

4. Interaction and Question-and-Answer Sessions:

82% of participants praised the interactive nature of the sessions. Resource persons actively addressed queries, ensuring clarity.


5. Technical Aspects and Coordination:

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


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
